Marienburg Germany

Spring 1945

Notable features include blown canopy, type 8-190.1025. Late three-piece gun cowl with small round bulge on rear in the lower position, No. 2, all antennas intact, no ETC 504 rack

COLORS: Undersurfaces; RLM 76 Light Blue; under front half of wing RLM 75 including bottom portion of landing gear door, rear half unpainted; ailerons RLM 76 Light Blue. Uppersurfaces; RLM 82 Bright Green/RLM 83 Dark Green; rear portion of canopy unpainted. Prop blades & spinner: RLM 70 Black-Green

Orignal National Markings: Fuselage; B4 800 mm Black outline crosses. H3 420 mm Black Hakenkreuz

Wings: Upper: B6 910 mm White outline crosses, Lower: B4 900 mm Black outline crosses German national markings overpainted then Russian stars applied in all eight locations Stenciling: Minimal - Werknummer on top of fin partially overpainted

"Black 4" W. Nr. 400271 III./JG 2

Großostheim, Germany May 1945

Notable features include blown canopy type 8-190.1025, only antenna intact is the FuG 25a, late three-piece gun cowl with round bulge on rear in the low position, No. 2, Fw factory data plate

Colors: Undersurfaces, RLM 76 Light Blue; front half of underwing RLM 75 Gray-Violet; wing tips RLM 76

Uppersurfaces, RLM 75 Gray-Violet/RLM 83 Dark Green, Black exhaust panel. Prop blades & spinner, RLM 70 Black-Green, spinnner, Black with White spiral. Fuselage I.D. Bands, Yellow/White/Yellow, 300 mm each with Black III. Gruppe vertical bar

National Markings: Fuselage: B4 800 mm Black outline crosses, H3 420 mm Black Hakenkreuz

Wings: Upper; B6 910 mm White outline crosses. Lower; B1b 900 mm Black crosses Stenciling: Not visible

"White 16" W.Nr. Unknown II./JG 301

Possibly Stendal, Germany

Notable features include blown canopy, late three piece gun cowl, with small round bulge on rear in the low position, No. 2. All antennas

COLORS: Undersurfaces; Light Green Uppersurfaces; RLM 82 Bright Green/RLM 83 Dark Green; No Black exhaust panel

Prop blades & spinner; RLM 70 Black-Green, spinner Black with White spiral provisional

National Markings: Fuselage: B4 800 mm Black outline crosses. H3 420 mm Black Hakenkreuz

Wings; Upper; B6 910 mm White outline crosses. Lower: B4 900 mm Black outline crosses

Stenciling: Factory standard provisional; JG 301 Red/Yellow bands on rear fuselage with Red II. Gruppe bar

"White 15" Fw 190 D-9 W. Nr. 600651 Unit unknown

National Markings: Fuselage; B3 600 mm White outline crosses with dark center, note overspray on starboard cross

Straubing, Germany

Notable features include blown canopy, 8-190.1025. All antennas intact Late three-piece gun cowl with no bulges or flares, No. 5, but upper engine cowl has small bulge commonly found on Mimetall D-9s. Damaged supercharger scoop, ETC 504 rack. Colors: Undersurfaces; RLM 76 Light Blue; some color variation or lack of paint on starboard underwing; Yellow undercowling typical of Fieseler D-9s and has RLM 83 mottling. Uppersurfaces; RLM 82 Bright Green/RLM 83 Dark Green with heavy mottling, possibly RLM 81 Brown-Violet; Light RLM 76 rudder, Prop blades & spinner - RLM 70 Black-Green, spinner Black with White spiral.

H3 530 mm Black Hakenkreuz

Wings: Upper: B6 910 mm White outline crosses. Lower: B1b 900 mm Black crosses

Stenciling: Factory standard; two data plates with the Anderungsstufe plate on the bottom.
