The controversy will never end, but of all the World War II fighter planes, the P-51D Mustang has to be regarded as the best allaround fighter. The Focke-Wulf 190 may have been a better dogfighter; the A6M5 Zero was probably the most nimble, but the tremendous range, firepower and speed of the Mustang *endeared it to all who flew this outstanding airplane. Designed in only 90 days for the RAF, the original A-36 design was a fair but not outstanding airplane. When the plane was wedded to the superb Rolls Royce Merlin engine, the results were phenomenal.
