Gloster Meteor F. Mk.8 "No.77. sq. RAAF"

Gloster Meteor se stal společně s De Havilland Vampírem standardní stíhačkou RAF těsně poválečného období. Po válečných verzích Mk.I a Mk.III byla vyvinuta první poválečná verze Mk.IV. V roce 1947 byl zahájen vývoj zdokonalené verze Mk.8. Od starší verze Mk.IV se lišila celkově zesílenou konstrukcí, delším trupem s novým překrytím kabiny a vystřelovacím sedadlem. Ocasní plochy byly zcela přepracovány. V křídelních gondolách byly instalovány výkonnější motory Derwent 8. RAF dostalo první kusy nové verze v roce 1949. Meteor Mk.8 sloužil nejen v řadách RAF, byl hojně exportován. Sloužil v letectvech Egypta, Belgie, Nizozemska, Brazílie, Dánska, Sýrie, Izraele, a Austrálie. Licenčně byl vyráběn v Nizozemí u Fokkera a v Belgii u Avions Fairey montovali Meteory z dodaných sestav.

S letectvem RAAF je spojeno největší bojové vystoupení Meteoru Mk.8. Do bojů v Koreji byla nasazena v červenci 1950 77. sq. RAAF jako první neamerická jednotka kontingentu UN. Původní výzbrojí byly pístové Mustangy. V dubnu 1951 byla jednotka stažena do Japonska a přeškolená na tryskové Meteory. Do bojů byla zpět nasazena v červenci 1951 z korejské základny Kimpo. Brzy se ukázalo, že Meteor Mk.8 výkonově nestačí na Mig-15, nejlepší stíhačku protivníka. Proto přešly od doprovodného stíhání k útokům na pozemní cíle. Jako bitevní stíhačky se Meteory velmi osvědčily, k útokům na pozemní cíle byly používány bomby a neřízené rakety. Odlétaly 4 836 bojových misí, sestřelily 4 (podle jiných podkladů 6) Migů-15, dále zničily přes 3 500 pevných cílů a více než 1 500 vozidel. Okolo třiceti Meteorů bylo v Koreji sestřeleno, většina z nich protiletadlovou palbou.

Australané na Meteorech bojovali až do konce Korejské války. Do Austrálie se 77. sq. RAAF vrátila v listopadu 1954 a Meteory používala až do srpna roku 1956. Austrálie celkem odebrala 113 Meteorů, z toho 94 kusů verze Mk.8

Gloster Meteor together with De Havilland Vampire were both RAF fighters just after WW 2. Subsequently to the war versions Mk.I and Mk.III the first post war version Mk.IV was developed. The development of the improved version Mk.8 started in 1947. It differed from the earlier Mk.IV by strengthened structure, longer fuselage with new canopy and ejection seat. The tailplanes were completely redesigned. More powerful Derwent 8 engines were installed in the wings' nacelles. First aircraft were delivered to RAF in 1949. Meteor Mk.8 didn't served only within RAF but was also exported. Meteors served with Egyptian, Belgian, Dutch, Brazilian, Danish, Syrian, Israeli and Australian air forces. It was also license produced by Fokker in Holland and Avions Fairey in Belgium where it was assembled from delivered subassemblies.

RAAF is connected with the biggest combat assignment of Meteor Mk.8s. In July 1950 was RAAF No. 77 squadron deployed to Korea as the first non-US unit within the UN forces. It was originally equipped with piston engined Mustangs. In April 1951 the unit was withdrawn to Japan for re-equipping to jet engined Meteors. It got back to combat area in July 1951 from its base at Kimpo. Soon it was revealed that Meteor Mk.8 is no match for the enemy's best fighter MIG-15. Therefore Meteors were re-assigned from escort fighter task to ground attacks. Meteors as attack planes were successful and they used both rockets and bombs for ground targets. They flew 4836 missions, shot down 4 (according to some sources 6) MIG-15s, destroyed over 3500 ground targets and 1500 vehicles. Probably 30 Meteors were shot down over Korea, most of them due to the anti-aircraft artillery.






Australians flew Meteors up to the end of the Korean War. RAAF No. 77 Squadron got back in Australia in November 1954 and used Meteors till August 1956. In sum Australia purchased 113 Meteors, from that 94 were of Mk.8 version.

Use part E15 as template for proper installation of rocket stabilizers



Gl. Meteor F. Mk.8 A77-17 pojmenovaný „Constipated“ neznámý pilot 77. sq. RAAF, Korea červenec 1951 až červen 1953. Levý trupový znak tohoto letounu byl neúplný po opravě poškození trupu. Tento letoun původně v Koreji létal s kresbou ďábla s vidlemi a nápisem Bowl 'Em Over. V té době jej pilotoval F/O Bruce Gogerly, jeden z Australanů majících na kontě sestřel Migu 15. Všechny australské Meteory nesly čísla a znaky na stejných místech.


Gl. Meteor F. Mk.8 A77-17 named „Constipated“, pilot unknown, No.77 Squadron RAAF, Korea, from July 1951 till June 1953. The port fuselage national insignia is incomplete due to the damaged fuselage section repair. This aircraft originally sported nose art of Devil with pitchfork and sign Bowl 'Em Over. At that time it was flown by F/O Bruce Gogerly, one of Australians who shot down MIG-15. All Australian Meteors wore numbers and insignias at the same locations.









Gl. Meteor F. Mk.8 A77-422

1952-červenec 1954.





Gl. Meteor F. Mk.8 A77-422









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


SH72106 F3F-2 "Flying Barrel"

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
